12. This perfect alignment suggests the builders understood astronomy well.
13. One of the biggest mysteries is how the ancient people moved and placed such huge
14. stones without modern machines. Some of the stones, called *sarsens*, came from areas
15. nearby, while others, known as *bluestones*, came from Wales, over 200 kilometers away.
16. Experts think people used wooden logs, ropes, sleds, and a lot of teamwork to move **them**
17. across rivers and hills. These efforts would have taken many years and hundreds of
18. workers.
19. In addition to scientific theories, Stonehenge has **inspired** many unusual and mysterious
20. ideas. Some believe it was built by giants or even aliens from another world. Others say
21. the place has magical powers or that it was a center for healing. Although these ideas are
22. not supported by evidence, they show how much this monument fascinates people.
23. Today, Stonehenge is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, which means it is protected
24. because of its historical and cultural importance. It is one of the most visited landmarks in
25. the UK. Every year, thousands of people gather at Stonehenge, especially during the
26. summer and winter solstices, to watch the sun rise or set and feel a connection with the
