2. also referred to as crime by threat or force. Because robbery involves injury or the threat of injury,

14. The reactions of the public to this were interesting and varied. There were people who were ready
15. to praise the power of the imagination of the criminals and their risky plan. They said that it must
16. have taken a man of genius *to picture* the crime, to pick his team and inspire its members with the
17. necessary devotion and determination. They said that such a person would have been loaded with
18. honours if he had carried out an operation of a similar scale against the enemy in wartime.
19. Others would not go so far. They admitted that this was a crime, but they also added that in fact
20. nobody but the banks had suffered, so there was no need for public *alarm*. Nobody had been
21. seriously injured, no private individual had been robbed.
22. But the majority of thoughtful people were profoundly disturbed. Nothing could mask the fact that
23. this was a robbery on a new and frightening scale, a great crime against the banks in particular and
24. against the law and society in general. Thus, they think that the society also has a role to play in
25. prevention of different crimes, but at the same time they don't diminish the role of judicial organs
26. and courts.
27. The *New York Times* called the crime a "British Western" and compared it to the darings of the
28. Jesse James and the Dalton Brothers gangs. British papers criticized the absence of a national police
