Robbery is defined as the taking of another's property by force or threat. It is sometimes 1. also referred to as crime by threat or force. Because robbery involves injury or the threat of injury, 2. it is considered a more serious crime than many of the other theft crimes. 3.

In August 1963 people in Britain were amazed to learn that a crime had been committed which seemed more appropriate to the stormy pioneering days of the American middle-west than to the peaceful countryside of England in the 1960s.

A group of criminals had staged a night-time raid on an express train. The train had been carrying 7. money from several Scottish banks to London. The amount of the stolen money was never 8. recovered. Though the gang did not use any firearms, Jack Mills, the train driver, was beaten over 9. the head with a metal bar. Mills was so severely injured that he never worked again. After the robbery, the gang hid abroad. The total amount stolen was over two and a half million pounds. 11.

A few hundred thousand pounds were recovered and some of the thieves were traced and arrested, 12. but most of the gang apparently escaped from the country. Thus, they were not arrested. 13.

The reactions of the public to this were interesting and varied. There were people who were ready 14. to praise the power of the imagination of the criminals and their risky plan. They said that it must 15. have taken a man of genius to picture the crime, to pick his team and inspire its members with the 16. necessary devotion and determination. They said that such a person would have been loaded with 17. honours if he had carried out an operation of a similar scale against the enemy in wartime. 18.

Others would not go so far. They admitted that this was a crime, but they also added that in fact nobody but the banks had suffered, so there was no need for public *alarm*. Nobody had been 20. seriously injured, no private individual had been robbed. 21.

But the majority of thoughtful people were profoundly disturbed. Nothing could mask the fact that 22. this was a robbery on a new and frightening scale, a great crime against the banks in particular and against the law and society in general. Thus, they think that the society also has a role to play in prevention of different crimes, but at the same time they don't diminish the role of judicial organs 25. and courts. 26.

The New York Times called the crime a "British Western" and compared it to the darings of the 2.7 Jesse James and the Dalton Brothers gangs. British papers criticized the absence of a national police force, saying that a lack of communication between departments made it easier for the lawbreakers get away.
