2. Miami (Florida), Bermuda, and San Juan (Puerto Rico). For many years, this region has been known
3. for strange events. Ships and airplanes have disappeared without a **trace**, and people have wondered
4. why. Because of this, the Bermuda Triangle is often called the “Devil’s Triangle”.

5. One of the most famous stories is about Flight 19. In December 1945, five U.S. Navy planes left
6. Florida for a training mission. Everything was going well, but later the pilots radioed that they were
7. lost and could not tell where they were. The communication became weaker and then stopped
8. completely. The planes were never seen again, and the rescue plane that went looking for them also
9. disappeared. This event shocked the world.

10. Over the years, many ships and planes have been lost in the Bermuda Triangle. Some people
11. believe there are natural causes. For example, strong storms can appear suddenly and cause ships to
12. sink or planes to crash. Others think the area has magnetic forces that confuse compasses and
13. instruments. This might make it hard for pilots and sailors to know where they are going.

14. There are also more unusual theories. Some people say that aliens or UFOs cause the
15. disappearances. Others believe there is an underwater city like Atlantis, which pulls ships underwater.
16. These ideas are exciting, but there is no scientific proof to support **them**. Another idea is that large
17. bubbles of gas, such as methane, rise from the ocean floor and cause ships to sink. These bubbles can
18. reduce the water’s density, making it hard for a ship to float. While this theory is based on real science,
19. it has not been clearly **linked** to the events in the Bermuda Triangle. Still, it shows how nature might
20. play a bigger role than we think.

21. Scientists have studied the area for many years. Some of them say that the number of accidents
22. in the Bermuda Triangle is not higher than in other busy parts of the ocean. They believe people just
23. notice these events more because of the stories. Also, many ships and planes pass through the area
24. every day without any problems.

25. Tourism in the Bermuda region is very popular today. Cruise ships and flights travel through it
26. all the time. Most travelers don’t worry about the old legends and enjoy the beautiful beaches and
27. clear blue water. For many people, the Bermuda Triangle is more of a mystery from the past than a
